

On April 21, 2017, you requested,  
 “the MWh produced by SNOPUD in 2015 in Snohomish County (excluding Camano Island), as well as a breakdown of the energy that went to residential, commercial, industrial, and ‘other’ groups within Snohomish County.”

The figures below show the total generation resources and their 2015 actual metered output that comprised the PUD’s 2015 Power Supply Portfolio. We historically have identified the info in the tables below as “2015 QuickFacts.” Based on your question about the MWh produced within Snohomish County, excluding Camano Island, we tallied the MWh production for the:

- 1) PUD’s owned hydro resources, or 372,177 MWh; and
- 2) Other Renewables, or 51,827 MWh (which includes rooftop solar, the output from contracts with two locally-owned and operated generators – one is a dairy digester and the other is a cogen facility fueled by woody biomass)

The sum for 2015 PUD energy produced within Snohomish County = 424,604 MWh



\* Some of the environmental attributes have been sold in order to support the PUD’s renewable energy and R&D efforts.

With regard to your request for a breakdown of the energy that went to residential, commercial, industrial and “other” groups, we do not calculate that information in exactly that way, but we thought it might be useful to provide the 2015 total MWh and percentage of retail consumption by residential, commercial, industrial and street lighting sectors.

This should allow you to perform calculations by resource type by sector or class that you desire.
